Those which are particularly relevant are set out below.

Measures applicable throughout the school

Contact with individuals who are unwell will be minimised by ensuring that those who have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school.

Staff and students will be expected to clean hands thoroughly more often than usual.

Equipment will not be shared, unless it has been cleaned beforehand or kept separate for different bubbles.

Good respiratory hygiene will be expected by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.

Enhanced cleaning will be introduced, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often.

Contact between individuals will be minimised and social distancing maintained wherever possible:

- Year 7 and 8 students will remain in group "bubbles"; some lunchtime provision and other interaction may take place within the year group but will be kept to a minimum and where possible outside;
- There will be staggered breaks and lunchtimes to support social distancing;
- Each Year group will be assigned a separate social time area;
- Students will use year group entrances & exits; these too will be staggered;
- Some specialist teaching, lunch time provision and other interaction may take place within the year group but will be kept to a minimum;
- Year 9 and above will work in whole year group "bubbles"; science, maths and english groups in years 9 to 11 will comprise the same group of students to reduce the amount of mixing.
- Sigma Sixth will be a bubble
- Each year group will be taught in a designated area of the school to limit interaction and movement around the school;
- One-way systems will be in place, where possible;
- Rooms will not be used by different bubbles in a single day without cleaning having taken place;
- There will be a minimum of 2 metres kept free at the front of each class;
- In all classrooms, tables will be in rows facing the front of the class.

PPE will be provided for first aid staff.

Staff and students will be able to use their own PPE if they wish.
